


# <u>Grounds Coordinator</u> position open!

- **1. Tzedakah:** This refers to the obligation to give to those in need. It is considered a mitzvah, or a religious commandment, to donate money, goods, or time to help others.
- **2. Gemilut Hasadim:** This is the act of performing kindness and good deeds. It is considered to be one of the most important Jewish values, as it promotes compassion and empathy towards others.
- **3. Tikkun Olam:** This refers to the obligation to repair the world and make it a better place. It is often translated as "social justice," and encompasses a wide range of activities, including volunteering, advocacy, and philanthropy.
- **4. Chesed:** This refers to acts of loving-kindness, which can take many forms, including volunteering, visiting the sick, and helping those who are in mourning.

If you haven't already, I encourage you to join in and help out. It's good for you and its good for everyone. If you are not sure and want to talk about your interests give me call or email me. I'm happy to explore the possibilities with you.



For the Temple, June is a month for looking back to the past year and forward to the next. Our Annual Meeting provides a 'secular' complement to the High Holidays for that purpose.

In that spirit, I'd like to first of all offer an enormous THANK YOU and YASHER KOACH to Peter Malinow as he concludes his three years as Temple president and co-president. Peter stepped in to the role at height of the pandemic; it was not an easy time to lead a congregation! And yet, Peter moved us forward. I particularly want to note what I think is one of Peter's most important successes: encouraging new, more shared, and younger leadership in the congregation. It's a trend he made a terrific start with and we'll flourish if we continue in that direction.

While I'm thanking Malinows, I also want to say THANK YOU and YASHER KOACH to Stephanie! As she and Peter take on some additional grandparental responsibilities this coming year, meaning more sustained trips to Wyoming, she's decided to retire from teaching our Jewish Explorations students. In Stephanie's first years teaching with us, she and Dara worked with me to refocus our curriculum, centering it on giving our children Jewish tools for human flourishing that would serve them throughout their lives. And she's been caring, diligent, and creative in fleshing that out. Most of all, she's loved the kids and they know it.

At the time I'm writing this, several initiatives are in process that will help us continue to expand and improve our ability to serve our children and their families. I believe that will also mean bringing more families into our Temple community. I expect we'll be able to say more at the Annual Meeting.

Finally, you'll be hearing about updating our Mission Statement, to better reflect (and present) who we are now, about a quarter century after we adopted our current statement. I believe that in the "Visioning Process" conversations, as well as conversations we had about who we are with our marketing consultant, Russ Benblatt, some definite core aspects of who we are and what we aspire to emerged. They include:

- the centrality of community enjoying each other's company and caring for one another;
- valuing the diversity of our relationships to Judaism;
- we 'do Jewish' in various ways, including learning, spirituality, food, tikkun olam, music, and art;
- we recognize that those ways continue to evolve;
- we're participatory and democratic;
- and we value rabbinic leadership.
- As we say in the current mission statement, we still joyfully accept the challenge of the ancient teaching: "Do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God."

As of this writing, the Board is in conversation about whether to bring a proposal for a new Mission Statement to this Annual Meeting. You'll hear more soon.

#### CHEVRA KADISHA

After a Jew dies, a burial society, the *Chevra Kadisha* (literally, "holy society") prepares the body for interment. This process, called *Taharah* (purification), involves the ritual cleansing and subsequent dressing of the body, by men for males and by women for females, in preparation for burial. This requires training in the traditions and prescribed methods involved in traditional Jewish burials. This is a very personal and meaningful mitzvah we perform to support our fellow members.
