**Interview with President Hillary Stern
by Winky Gordon guest interviewer**

Q: What's happening at Temple Bnai Israel these days?

A: There is a lot happening in our community. The movers and shakers are busy making things happen. The Jewish Explorations staff have developed a full curriculum of classes and special events for our children and families to get involved with. The membership committee is actively engaged in new ways of promoting, advertising, and marketing using the most up-to-date digital technology. The Tikkun Olam Committee recently participated in a Climate Change Rally in Hartford, CT, joining many other environmental activist groups from all over Connecticut. Attending the rally provided a sense of camaraderie and hope. The Ritual Committee and other members gathered for a Shabbat Service initiative, brainstorming new ways to enliven and enhance our Shabbat service experience and reimagine the sanctuary space. Lastly, several musicians and singers are collaborating to bring music to our Shabbat services and other events. There is much more happening, but that's a significant amount right there.

Q: What do you see as the Temple Bnai Israel community's current strengths and opportunities for growth?

A: A major strength here at Temple Bnai Israel is the abundance of big-hearted individuals who are always ready to step up and get things done. It takes a tremendous amount of effort to keep this building running smoothly and ensure that the lights stay on. We are fortunate to have some dedicated long-time members who have been working tirelessly behind the scenes for many years, contributing to the smooth operation of our organization. However, it is essential that we also welcome new faces to take on these responsibilities in the near future.

Q: What are your hopes for the leadership of the synagogue after you step down from the Presidency this coming June?

A: We are in need of a new president, or we must explore alternative approaches to fulfilling the responsibilities of leadership. Currently, the board is actively working on developing a different structure for the leadership of the temple. I had the role of Co-President for one year, and now I am the sole President. Having a supportive Board of

CHEVRA KADISHA

After a Jew dies, a burial society, the *Chevra Kadisha* (literally, "holy society") prepares the body for interment. This process, called *Taharah* (purification), involves the ritual cleansing and subsequent dressing of the body, by men for males and by women for females, in preparation for burial. This requires training in the traditions and prescribed methods involved in traditional Jewish burials. This is a very personal and meaningful mitzvah we perform to support our fellow members.

Thank you to all who joined in the Climate March on February 2nd; overall it was a successful event with a diverse coalition of environmentalists and advocates. The overall priorities of this march were to secure promises for future funding for energy assistance and energy efficiency programs, to expand renewable energy and green electrification, and to accomplish such goals in an equitable and diverse way. These priorities are outlined in this document produced by Save the Sound: <https://www.climateactionct.org/2024-agenda> We will provide opportunities for follow-up actions during this Legislative Session so please stay tuned.

On a similar note, the TOC has rescheduled the weatherization kick-off event that had to be canceled due to weather last July. **Please mark your calendars and invite you Temple Bnai Israel friends for Sunday, April 7th at 2:00pm.** We will have vendors available to sign up for home energy audits to make you eligible for CT rebates for efficiency upgrades, the wonderful Mobile Energy Van with lots of interactive science exhibits on energy, and WAIM communities who will be interested in making a difference in their own communities and within their houses of worship. I know several of you have already reached out to me to let me know that you have had your audits completed or scheduled and I hope next steps have been proceeding with relative ease. Please let me know if you have an HES audit scheduled (you will be able to do so on April 7th). Also note that our synagogue is taking advantage of the program and is in the process of replacing most of the lighting with high efficiency bulbs, an extensive project which Jim Baber and Doreen Simonsen have been overseeing!

We had an extraordinary HIAS Refugee Shabbat event on the Shabbat of February 3rd where Rabbi Megan Doherty spoke about some of HIAS' projects in Israel and at our southern border. The urgency of immigration reform was apparent from the stories she shared. We had an equally extraordinary repast provided by our own Chef Yasmin from Alsham Chef. Yasmin and her family were resettled in Willimantic from Syria around 5 years ago! It was an incredible Shabbat feast and I think we all agree that we will have to find another opportunity to order from her in the future.

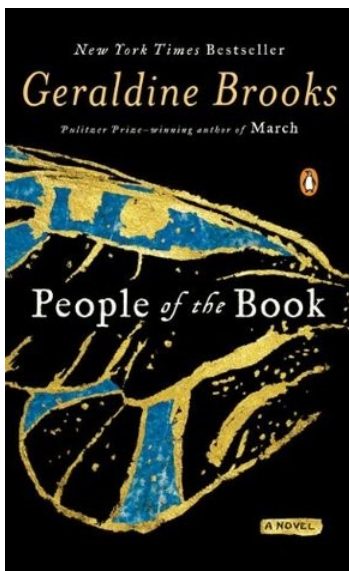

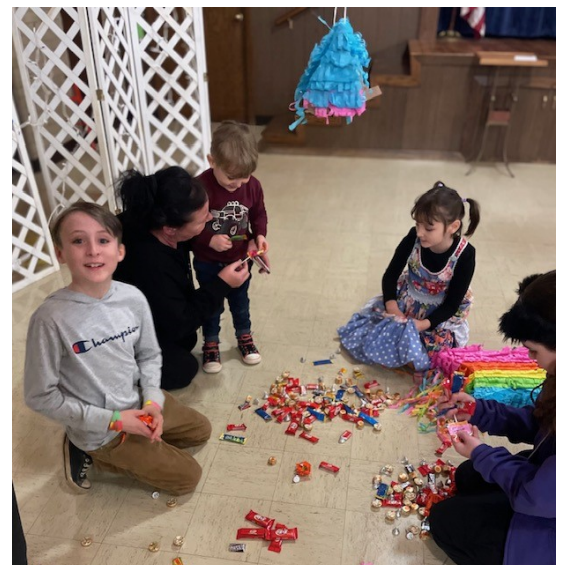
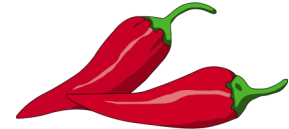
